Mark Your Calendars (Mal O'Connor)

Sat., May 25th - Beach Cleanup 9:30 a.m.: Pete Jackson invites all who can make it to bring a rake or other tools, a pair of work gloves, and a large garbage bag. We'll make quick work of clearing rubbish and flotsam from our beaches, the kayak launch and recreation areas.

Sat., May 25th - Boat Stickers 10am-12pm: Bill and Kathy Conlin will be at the kayak launch area to provide all who store kayaks, canoes, paddleboards and other craft with 2024 stickers. All craft must have stickers if stored at the kayak launch area. (If you do not have a key to the shed where paddles, vests, and other recreation equipment are stored, make sure to let Bill and Kathy know when you pick up your sticker.)

Sat. June 15th - GHCA Members Meeting 10 a.m.: Via Zoom. This is an important one. The three Vision 2030 Teams will update us on their recommendations, and the Board will recommend which of those they recommend we invest in over the next few years. **Make sure to hold the date** if you want to have a voice in these decisions. The agenda, proposed budget and Zoom link will be sent a week prior to the meeting.

Sat., June 22nd - Season Kickoff Dinner 5-8:30pm: We are excited to announce that this year we will be at the General Stanton Inn for drinks and dinner. Please fill out the enclosed Reservation Form and return it ASAP with your entrée selection and check.

GHCA Vision 2030 (AJ Emanuel)

The Vision teams worked hard throughout the off-season to advance the Vision 2030 work. To reflect for a moment, based on the 2022 survey where we engaged a broad contingent of our GHCA community, our members said they wanted the association to focus on the following:

- 1) The Beach and Beach Access
- 2) Preserving what we have while making improvements
- 3) The Safety & Health of our community
- 4) Recreation (including tennis, pickleball, the kayak launch, bocce and other uses for the recreation area
- 5) Improving the water quality in Green Hill Pond

Due to a significant amount of work specifically in the Beach and Pond area we decided this winter to separate the Beach & Pond team and create two teams. We now have four focused teams with four team leaders. These leaders have been working diligently on our community's Vision 2030 priorities.

The Pond team is led by Dan Tanona, Beach, led by Maureen Morse, Recreation, led by Maria DiMauro and Health & Safety, led by Tony Flynn. All four teams have made great progress on:

- Defining Scope of Work
- Researching Opportunities and Challenges
- Establishing Priorities
- Developing Cost & Timing for Implementing Actions

We are in the process of finalizing presentations to share our work and recommendations with the GHCA Board in May, and Member Community in June. Make sure to attend the <u>June 15th Members Meeting</u> to learn more specifics about our approach, recommendations, timeline and ways you can participate in this work moving forward. The Beach (Mal O'Connor)

Most of the beaches in the Northeastern U.S. experienced severe erosion, during the three major storms we had in late December and in January. As part of the Vision 2030 initiative, the



Beach Team is exploring multiple possible ways to gain beach access for GHCA members in the future.

Many thanks to Tim Evnin for putting new sand on the right of way to the association beach, as part of his maintenance berm project, and for shoring up the viewing area where the benches are. Without the additional sand, we would likely have no place to sit and enjoy the view.

Much of what was a sandy beach a few years ago is now a field of cobble and boulders. You can still swim occasionally at low tide if you can make your way across the cobble to the waterline. Remember: We will not be hiring a lifequard, so **swimming is at your own risk**.

Racquet Sports (Kathy and Bill Conlin)

The tennis/pickleball courts are ready for the season. Please abide by the rules, including "No-play before 8am" including use of the leaf blower.

There is a crack on the tennis side of the courts that will need to be addressed, so there may be a few weekdays where that side is closed. Make sure to read the rules and regulations posted in the message center at the courts. We created a Racquet Club tab on the GHCA website. There you will also find the rules and regs, a listing of Racquet Club members with their contact info, and their self-rated skill level. If you do not want to include your contact information, please indicate this on the Racquet Club renewal form you will receive via email. But consider: Other members may want to reach you to set up play dates.

On weekends, remember to use the white board to sign up for a court if they are occupied. Refer to Rules and Regs #6 & 7 for guidance. Currently, there is no process to reserve court time except for pre-scheduled Pickleball specified level play.

Tennis

Membership was robust last year and, hopefully, will be so again this year. Membership dues will remain at \$150 for GHCA members for both pickleball and tennis unless you are an associate member. Pickleball

This summer we will provide the contact for private lessons or, if people are interested, clinics. They can be arranged via Bob Burian who instructed last year. (Bob Burian 401-641-9032). Examples of Clinics could be: serve, return of serve, third shot drop; resets, rolls, slice; backhand, backhand slice, overheads and lobs. Let Kathy Conlin know if you are interested and



provide your contact info. She will compile the requests and pass them along to Bob. He will contact people directly.

We plan to offer organized drop-in play again this year. Kathy Conlin will post a schedule in the message centers late May when it has been planned out. Remember to provide your own balls, which are available online for purchase from many sources.

Green Hill Yacht Club (Kathy and Bill Conlin)

The communal kayaks saw a lot of use last season and will be available again this summer. Demand for kayak slots is high, and slots will be limited to one per household this season. It is expected a slot will be available to all households who request one. We have had many requests the past two years but then slots remain empty. Please do not request a slot unless you are using it. Write in that you need stickers only if you only need stickers. We have the stickers from previous years and can see who hasn't picked them up or used their slot. Remember: Whenever you are using kayaks or other watercraft, Wear your life jacket.

All watercraft must have a GHCA sticker to access the launch area. Stickers will be distributed again this year on Saturday, May 25th, from 10am-12noon - weather permitting. (The rain date is Sunday, May 26th.) If you are unable to attend, please send a friend to pick up your stickers or request that they be mailed to you so that distribution doesn't linger throughout the summer.

The "ground racks" have been underutilized. Please put your kayak on a **ground rack** if space is available. It makes access and maintenance much easier. This is a good spot for canoes and larger craft too. **Do not block access to the water entrance or obstruct other people's access to their kayaks**. This placement will make it easier for everyone to launch their watercraft. When returning the communal kayaks for storage, **place the kayaks upside down or on their side so they do not retain water.**

Storms that occur in the off season have been historic this year. The water rose halfway up the access path from GH Beach RD this winter. Kayaks left on the ground where floating, the ground racks were moved, and water rose to the lower level of the existing racks.. Therefore, we ask each kayak owner to remove all watercraft in the Fall by Thanksgiving. Last year many people ignored this request and kayaks had to be pulled up out of the flood. **PLEASE** <u>be</u> <u>courteous and responsible and remove your craft no later than Thanksgiving</u> <u>weekend</u>. It should not be the responsibility of the committee to manage other's kayaks after a flood event.
